

MAAP PHILIPPINES CLINCHES BEST POSTER AWARD at the TRANSNAV 2025: Advancing Maritine Sustainability

From June 11 to 13, 2025, the 16th International Conference on Marine Navigation and Safety of Sea Transportation (<u>TransNav 2025</u>) was held at the Gdynia Maritime University (UMG), Poland. <u>https://transnav2025.umg.edu.pl/</u>

The conference was organized by the Faculty of Navigation of Gdynia Maritime University and the Nautical Institute (NI). A broad range of peerreviewed papers sparked meaningful discussion on important and emerging topics such as Artificial Intelligence (AI), data analysis and cyber security, green shipping and inland navigation, GNSS and offshore technologies, ship routing and maintenance, human factors, MET, and the workload on seafarers. This distinguished global forum brought together maritime professionals and academics from 83 countries, represented by over 200 scientists and professionals from the maritime industry. TRANSNAV provided a unique platform for interdisciplinary dialogue regarding the current and future landscape of maritime navigation.



The Maritime Academy of Asia and the Pacific (MAAP) was represented at the conference by its External Relations Director, Prof. Angelica M. Baylon, PhD, who also serves as Honorary Secretary of the Nautical Institute of the Philippine Branch, as well as LTGEN (TAOC-IG), and PAEPI Global Chair and President Emeritus. Dr. Baylon is a member of the Scientific Programme Committee and the **International Programming** Council of TransNav - The International Journal on Marine Navigation and Safety of Sea Transportation since 2007 to date and a Fellow TRANSNAV since 2017.

The Rector of Gdynia Maritime University, Professor and Doctor Captain Adam Weintrit, presented three awards: the Best Paper, Best Presentation, and Best Poster Awards.
